Description:

Florida's voters placed municipal Home Rule powers into the Florida Constitution on November 5, 1968, during the regular elections as an amendment to Article VIII. This power has enabled each city, town, and village across Florida to consider, adopt, revise or remove its own laws without the need to seek legislative permission from the state and has further served as the foundation upon which every municipality builds its governmental structure.

Action Requested:

Adopt Resolution No. 2018-08, honoring fifty years of municipal Home Rule in the Florida Constitution and committing to an educational initiative to help Floridians understand this beneficial right.

Message from Florida League of Cities President Gil Ziffer

Sometimes Florida's cities find themselves at odds with the state Legislature over the principle of Home Rule. That cherished concept, supported by an overwhelming majority of Florida's citizens, reflects the view that the closer government is to the people, the more effective, fair and responsive it will be. Over this past year, we have seen a very different approach taking hold in the Legislature. 13	WHEREAS, Florida's voters placed municipal Home Rule powers into the Florida

17	WHEREAS, this power has enabled each city, town and village across the Sunshine
18	State to consider, adopt, revise or remove its own laws without the need to seek legislative
19	permission from the state and has further served as the foundation upon which every
20	municipality builds its governmental structure; and

22	WHEREAS, the political climate within the Florida Legislature has recently included
23	many attacks on these powers; and
24	
25	WHEREAS, grassroots measures calling such actions wrong and declaring that local
26	decisions be made at the local level by local officials must continue so that all legislators clearly
27	understand Florida's Home Rule as a constitutional power and one upheld in state statutes; and
28	
29	WHEREAS, a 50th anniversary is a fitting time for all municipalities to engage their
30	respective citizens to educate them about the Florida Constitution and local laws, so that all
31	Floridians may continue to receive the many benefits of Home Rule.

33	NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Village Council of the Village of Estero,
34	Florida:

36	Section 1. That this anniversary presents a tremendous opportunity to educate all
37	citizens about Florida's Constitution, municipal government and Home Rule authority, and
38	that all necessary resources shall be provided for such public information.

40	Section 2. That the Village of Estero will actively challenge all efforts to reduce or
41	erode this cherished right and further employ all efforts to ensure state and federal
42	government partners understand that a one-size-fits-all approach to governance is not in the
43	interests of Florida citizens.

46	protect, as it provides each municipality the ability to preserve and enhance the myriad					
47	characteristics that make each one uniquely special and that maintains its quality of life.
