11	WHEREAS, the Village of Estero was incorporated by referendum held on November
12	4, 2014; and

14	WHEREAS, the Charter of the Village of Estero ("Charter") at Section 11, "General
15	Provisions," paragraph (5) "Transitional Ordinances and Resolutions," provides that all
16	applicable lawful Lee County ordinances currently in place at the time of passage of the
17	referendum, unless specifically referenced in the Charter, shall remain in place unless
18	rescinded by the Village Council or unless they are in conflict with an ordinance, rule or
19	regulation of the Village; and
20	
21	WHEREAS, the Village Council has determined that it is in the best interests and
22	welfare of the Village and its residents to revise certain provisions of the Lee County Code to
23	specifically apply to the Village.
24	
25	NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Village Council of the Village of Estero,
26	Florida:
27	
28	Section 1. Lee County Code Sections amended.
29	
30	The following sections were included in the Code of Laws and Ordinances, of the
31	Village of Estero, Florida by virtue of their inclusion in the Lee County Code and are hereby
32	amended as ordinances of the Village of Estero. These amendments are not intended to affect
33	the validity of these provisions as laws of Lee County.

35	Lee County Code Chapter 25 Special Events Permitting, previously adopted by
36	reference is amended to read as follows.

38	Sec. 25-1. Title.
39	
40	This chapter is titled and may be cited as the " <u>Lee County Estero</u> Special Events
41	Permitting Ordinance."

Sec. 25-2.	Definitions.

The following words and phrases, when used in this chapter are defined as follows:

Film means a production of a feature film, TV special/commercial/pilot/series, industrial film/video or photography shoot.

Private property means property that is owned, leased, operated, maintained or controlled by one (1) or more individuals or private entities.

Public property means property that is owned, leased, operated, maintained or controlled by the county village.

Sale or consumption of alcohol within <u>Lee County Estero</u> facilities and public parks means an event being held within a <u>county village</u> facility or public park at which alcohol is to be sold or consumed.

Special event means a temporary preplanned gathering or event of an entertainment, cultural, recreational, educational, political, religious, or sporting nature, or any other nature, that is sponsored by an individual or entity and is open to the public in general with an expected attendance of one thousand (1,000) or more, whether on public or private property.

Use of county village property means an event being held within Estero unincorporated Lee County, in a county park or facility.

Sec. 25-3. Permit.

(a) Required. The following event types require a permit:

(1) An event that is expected to draw one thousand (1,000) or more persons at any session as participants or spectators, which is proposed to be held on public or private property; and/or

(2) An event that is expected to be held on public property or within a county village park; and/or
 (3) An event at which alcohol is expected to be sold or consumed within a county

village facility or public park; and/or

(4) An event at which filming or photography will affect public property or on private property and incorporating pyrotechnics, explosives or other incendiary devices, firearms or use of gunfire or involves stunts of any kind.

(b) Application. At least thirty (30) days prior to the scheduled start of the event, the completed application with descriptive plans for all arrangements must be submitted to the community development department along with any applicable fees as outlined in the external fees and charges manual as may be amended from time to time. The applicant must comply with any and all conditions set forth in the application by the required sign-off agencies and as required by the county village manager or designee.

- (c) Conditions. The <u>eounty village</u> reserves the right to establish such additional conditions, criteria or detailed specifications for the special event permit as it may deem necessary to carry out the intent of this article, for the protection of the public health, safety and welfare of the public.
- (d) Advertising. No person, corporation, partnership, or other organization may advertise, conduct, maintain, or sell or furnish tickets for an outdoor concert or event in Lee County Estero unless and until that person or entity has obtained a permit from the county village.
- (e) Insurance. The applicant, at its sole expense, agrees to procure and maintain in force during the entire term of the application, liability insurance in the amounts determined by eounty village risk management to protect against damages or other claims arising from use of county village property by the applicant or its guests. Other limits may also be established by county village risk management for events which will be serving or consuming alcoholic beverages at approved county village property. The insurance policy must also include coverage for the applicant's contingent liability on damages, claims or losses. "Lee County Estero board of county commissioners village council" must be named as "additional insured" on the certificate of insurance, and the certificate must be delivered to Lee County Estero prior to the applicant's use of the property. The insurance may not be canceled during the term of the event, if this occurs, the county village has the right to revoke approvals related to use of the county village property for the event, without recourse by the applicant.
- (f) Bond. At its discretion, subject to other applicable laws or ordinances, the county village may require an indemnity and/or performance security bond for an event. The bond must be with a corporate bonding company authorized to do business in the State of Florida, or a cash bond in the form of a cashier's check payable to the board. The bond must indemnify Lee County Estero, its agents or employees against any and all claims arising out of the preparations, conduct or aftermath of the event.

Sec. 25-4. Indemnification.

The applicant agrees to indemnify, release and save harmless the board village against any and all claims, costs, demands, damages, judgments or injuries of any nature arising from the conduct or management of, or from any work or thing whatsoever done in or about county village property or any building or structure appurtenant thereto or equipment thereof during the term of this permit, or arising during the term of use from any act of negligence of the applicant, applicant's agents, contractors, or employees, or arising from any accident, injury, or damage whatsoever, however caused, to any person or persons, or to any property of any person, persons, corporation or corporations, occurring during the term of this agreement on, in, or about said county village property, and from and against all costs, attorney's fees, expenses and liabilities occurring in connection with any such claim or any action or proceeding brought thereon.

133 Sec. 25-5. Delivery, acceptance and surrender of premises. 134 135 The applicant agrees to accept the county village property on possession as (a) 136 being in a satisfactory state of repair and in sanitary condition. The applicant must surrender the premises to the county village in the same 137 138 condition as when the applicant takes possession, allowing for reasonable use and wear, and 139 damage by acts of God. The applicant agrees to remove all business signs or symbols placed 140 on the premises by the applicant before redelivery of the premises to the county village, and 141 restore the premises to the condition in which it existed before their placement. Any signs and 142 markings created or used in connection with this event must be temporary and removable; 143 painting roadways, trees or any other fixed object is strictly prohibited. The applicant agrees 144 to clear the county village property of litter at the close of the event. 145 146 Sec. 25-6. Consideration of application. 147 148 Upon receipt of the completed application with all required attachments, the eounty 149 village manager or designee must review and make final determination on all applications. The 150 county village manager or designee will approve applications when all conditions have been 151 met. The county village reserves the right to deny any applications. Should the application be 152 denied, it will be in writing and for good cause. Good cause would be, but not limited to, failure 153 to comply with the necessary arrangements dictated by the sign-off agencies or an event that 154 would create a severe and actual nuisance to the surrounding community. 155 156 Sec. 25-7. Violations. 157 158 The county village may revoke the event permit granted under this chapter upon the 159 occurrence of any violation of this chapter. 160 161 Section 2. **Effective Date.** 162 163 This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption. 164 165
