My name is Kathleen Fitzgerald and I serve as the volunteer President of the Wildcat Run Community Association. I'm writing to you to confirm that in the conversations that we've had with Scott Bland and reps for ARGO Land over the past 3 years, we've not been interested in a connection between the 2 properties. In the past this opportunity was presented by other owners and the consideration of a shared entry gatehouse with a roundabout was proposed. Residents here were more than concerned about many issues including the location of this proposed new entry into Wildcat Run, potential access and security issues and cost considerations for Wildcat Run.

For these reasons we confirm our position of not wishing to have an interconnect between Wildcat Run and Corkscrew Crossing. We have instead negotiated an agreement for an enhanced landscape buffer between the two communities and will again present this document to the Village of Estero. We look forward to attending the upcoming Zoning Hearing for this property.
