FEMA to Provide Direct Temporary Housing Assistance in Four Counties

As survivors recover from Hurricane Ian, rental resources may not be available in some communities for displaced residents. To assist these households, FEMA is providing travel trailers and larger manufactured housing units to eligible households in four counties: Charlotte, Collier, DeSoto and Lee. It takes time to transport, permit, install and inspect these units. We are working as quickly as possible with the state and local authorities to provide housing to survivors.

Transitional Sheltering Assistance

The state of Florida and FEMA have activated the Transitional Sheltering Assistance (TSA) program for Hurricane Ian survivors in Charlotte, Collier, DeSoto, Flagler, Hardee, Highlands, Hillsborough, Lake, Lee, Manatee, Orange, Osceola, Pinellas, Polk, Putnam, Sarasota, Seminole, St. Johns and Volusia counties. Survivors from these counties who have applied for disaster assistance may be eligible to shelter in a hotel or motel paid for by FEMA. By the Numbers

- **\$1.4 billion** in federal grants, disaster loans and flood insurance payments.

How to Apply for FEMA Assistance

Homeowners and renters in the following counties who had uninsured losses from Hurricane Ian may be eligible for federal disaster assistance. FEMA may provide financial help with temporary housing expenses, basic home repairs and other essential disaster-related needs.

- Eligible counties are Brevard, Charlotte, Collier, DeSoto, Flagler, Glades, Hardee, Hendry, Highlands, Hillsborough, Lake, Lee, Manatee, Monroe, Okeechobee, Orange, Osceola, Palm Beach, Pasco, Pinellas, Polk, Putnam, Sarasota, Seminole, St. Johns and Volusia

The line is open every day from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m. ET. Help is available in most languages. Privately Owned Access Routes to Your Home

Grants from FEMA's Individuals and Households Program may be used to repair privately owned access routes such as driveways, roads, bridges and docks that were damaged by Hurricane Ian, if the access affects a dwelling that was owner-occupied. [Privately-owned Access Routes | FEMA.gov](#)

Personal Property Assistance

If you live in one of the 26 counties eligible for FEMA Individual Assistance and had personal property damaged or destroyed by Hurricane Ian, FEMA may provide financial assistance to repair or replace it based on eligibility requirements. [Personal Property and FEMA Assistance | FEMA.gov](#)

Wells and Septic Systems

For private wells and septic systems, FEMA may reimburse you for the cost of a professional, licensed technician's estimate detailing the necessary repairs or replacement of your disaster-damaged systems. FEMA may also pay for the actual repair or replacement cost of your septic system or private well, which typically are not covered by homeowner's insurance. FEMA has taken steps to help owners and renters of disaster-damaged property validate ownership and/or occupancy as part of the application for financial assistance. It's Important to Submit the SBA Disaster Loan Application

FEMA may refer applicants to the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) with information on how to apply for a disaster loan. If your application is approved, you are not obligated to accept the SBA loan, but it's important to submit the loan application as soon as possible to prevent you from being disqualified from other possible financial assistance from FEMA. Critical Needs Assistance

FEMA may provide financial assistance to applicants in the 26 counties designated for Individual Assistance who have immediate or critical needs because they are displaced from their primary dwelling. [Critical Needs Assistance | FEMA.gov](#)

Clean and Sanitize Assistance

Operation Blue Roof

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, in coordination with FEMA, may be able to assist eligible homeowners with temporary roof repairs. Operation Blue Roof is a free service to homeowners impacted by Hurricane Ian in Charlotte, Collier, DeSoto, Lee, and Sarasota counties. Flood Insurance

If your National Flood Insurance Program policy has expired, you may be able to reinstate it without a lapse in coverage. FEMA has extended the renewal grace period for Florida flood insurance policyholders affected by Hurricane Ian. The extension applies to policyholders whose expiration dates were Aug. 25, 2022, through Oct. 23, 2022. If the renewal date was Oct. 23, 2022, the policy may be renewed by Jan. 21, 2023. The NFIP also has extended the proof of loss requirement for policyholders who experienced flood damage from Hurricane Ian from the standard 60 days to 365 days from the date of loss.
