

Build an Emergency Supply Kit

Emergencies can happen anytime, so having a well-stocked emergency kit is essential. Being prepared helps you and your family stay safe, healthy, and informed during crises like hurricanes, floods, wildfires, or power outages. Your kit should have enough supplies to last at least seven days, including food, water, medicine, and important documents. Customize it to fit your household's needs, including items for infants, elderly members, and pets.
