13	WHEPEAS in 2014 the Floride Legislature spectral a law legalizing law THC
14	WHEREAS, in 2014 the Florida Legislature enacted a law legalizing low-THC
15 16	medical cannabis in Florida; and
17	WHEREAS, in 2016 the Florida Legislature expanded the law to legalize medical
18	cannabis in Florida; and
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20	WHEREAS, future constitutional amendments and legislation may further expand the
21	legal use of cannabis in Florida; and
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23	WHEREAS, a comprehensive State licensing and regulatory framework for the
24	cultivation, processing, and dispensing of cannabis now exists; and
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26	WHEREAS, the comprehensive State licensing and regulatory framework directs that
27	the criteria for the number and location of, and other permitting requirements that do not
28	conflict with state law or department rule for, dispensing facilities of cannabis businesses may
29 20	be determined by local ordinance; and
30 31	WHEREAS connection by singages licensed pursuent to the law have begun cultivating
32	WHEREAS, cannabis businesses licensed pursuant to the law have begun cultivating cannabis for processing and dispensing; and
33	califacts for processing and dispensing, and
34	WHEREAS, the dispensing of cannabis is currently illegal under federal law and the
35	United States Drug Enforcement Agency has recently confirmed that cannabis remains a
36	Schedule I drug under federal law, but the United States Department of Justice has discussed
37	federal enforcement of such laws with respect to state regulated cannabis operations in the
38	2012 "Cole Memorandum;" and

40	WHEREAS, potential adverse impacts on the health, safety, and welfare of residents
41	and business from secondary effects associated with the distribution of cannabis exist,
42	potentially including, offensive odors, trespassing, theft, fire hazards, increased crime in and
43	about the dispensary, robberies, negative impacts on nearby businesses, nuisance problems,
44	and increased DUI incidents; and
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46 WHEREAS, certain of the above potential adverse impacts are accentuated by the current difficulties experienced by cannabis businesses in obtaining banking services 47 48 necessitating such businesses to operate on a cash basis; and 49 50 WHEREAS, there exists the potential for misappropriation of medical cannabis to 51 non-medical uses; and 52 53 WHEREAS, an overabundance of dispensing facilities can affect the viability of such 54 facilities, result in compliance issues, lead to the improper diversion of products, and 55 accentuate threats to the public health, safety, and welfare; and 56 WHEREAS, in November of this year, Florida voters will decide whether to approved 57 58 an amendment to the Florida Constitution to legalize the cultivation, production, and 59 dispensing of medical cannabis for a broader population of eligible patients; and 60 61 WHEREAS, Florida laws relating to the cultivation, production, and dispensing of 62 cannabis products are rapidly changing - raising substantial questions about whether cannabis-63 related land uses, as a category of commercial use, may have deleterious and negative secondary effects on surrounding land uses and communities; and 64 65 66 WHEREAS, the purpose of this ordinance is to place a temporary moratorium on the 67 opening of certain new cannabis dispensing facilities, and on the expansion or relocation of 68 certain existing cannabis dispensing facilities; and 69 WHEREAS, the Village hereby finds that the temporary moratorium imposed by this 70 71 ordinance is intended to give the Village the time reasonably necessary to investigate the 72 impacts of cannabis dispensing facilities, and if necessary, to promulgate reasonable 73 regulations relating to such establishments; and 74 75 WHEREAS, the Village hereby finds that this ordinance advances an important 76 government purpose by reducing the likelihood of the unregulated negative secondary effects 77 of cannabis dispensing facilities; and 78 79 WHEREAS, the Village hereby finds that this ordinance is in the best interest of the 80 public health, safety, and welfare; and 81 82 WHEREAS, the Village has determined it is in the public interest to adopt this 83 Ordinance pursuant to the Village police powers to protect the health, safety, and welfare of 84 the public. 85 86 **NOW, THEREFORE**, be it ordained by the Village Council of the Village of Estero, 87 Florida: 88 89 90

100	(1) The following words and phrases, when used in this Ordinance, shall have the
101	meanings ascribed to them in this Ordinance:

103	a. Cannabis means all parts of any plant of the genus Cannabis, whether
104	growing or not; the seeds thereof; the resin extracted from any part of the
105	plant; and every compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or
106	preparation of the plant or its seeds or resin.

108	b. Cannabis dispensing business or business shall mean a business location
109	offering cannabis for retail sale pursuant to a license to dispense cannabis
110	issued under applicable law.
111	
112	c. Compassionate Use Act shall mean section 381.986, Florida Statutes, and
113	chapter 2016-123, Laws of Florida, as amended from time to time, and
114	any rules or regulations promulgated thereunder.

116	d. State shall mean the State of Florida.
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118	(2) In addition to the definitions contained in Subsection (1), other terms used in
119	this Ordinance shall have the meaning ascribed to them in the Compassionate Use Act,
120	and such definitions are incorporated into this Ordinance by this reference.

123	Beginning on the effective date of this Ordinance, for a period of twelve (12) months
124	from the effective date, a moratorium is hereby imposed on the opening of new
126	cannabis dispensing businesses and on the expansion or relocation of existing cannabis
127	dispensing businesses in the Village.

129	a. During the moratorium, it is unlawful and a violation of this ordinance for
130	any person or entity to open or cause to be opened any cannabis
131	dispensing business within the Village.

133	b. During the moratorium, it is unlawful and a violation of this ordinance for
134	any person or entity to relocate or cause to be relocated any cannabis
135	dispensing business within the Village.

any person or entity to expand or cause to be expanded any cannabis 137 138 dispensing business within the Village. 139 140 d. During the moratorium, the Village shall not accept, process or approve 141 any application for business tax receipts, licenses, building permits, land 142 use permits, or any development permits concerning or related to a 143 cannabis dispensing business. 144 145 e. During the moratorium, the Village shall not accept, process or approve 146 any business tax receipts, building permits, land use permits, or any development permits concerning or related to a cannabis dispensing 147 148 business. 149 150 f. During the moratorium, the Village shall not accept, process or approve 151 any licenses, permits, or approvals for any property, entity, or individual 152 for the sale or dispensation of cannabis so long as this ordinance is in 153 effect. 154 155 Nothing in this temporary moratorium shall be construed to prohibit the use of cannabis 156 pursuant to the Compassionate Use Act or other applicable Florida Law, or the delivery 157 of cannabis in compliance with the Compassionate Use Act or other applicable Florida 158 Law. 159 160 Section 4. Study and Recommendations. 161 162 The Village Manager is hereby directed to study land development regulations for cannabis dispensaries and the impact of such regulations in other jurisdictions. 163 164 165 Penalties. Section 5. 166 167 Any person or entity who violates any provision of this Ordinance or who fails to 168 comply therewith, or with any of the requirements thereof, shall be fined in an amount not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500.00) per violation, per day, or be imprisoned 169 170 for a period of time not to exceed sixty (60) days. 171 172 Section 6. Severability. 173 174 If any provision of this ordinance or its application to any person or circumstance is 175 held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications of this 176 ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and 177 to this end the provisions of this ordinance are severable. 178 179 180
